A couple of the big projects we are working on now are a commemoration of the 10th anniversary of the 9/11 tragedy. This looks to be a very large affair and I think you will be proud to say that your American Legion Post was responsible for making it happen.

We are also working to supply the Village with a piece of Static Memorial equipment for display. We are not sure exactly what we may be able to get yet but we hope to know shortly.
