Our membership is gauged against what we had at the Dept. of IL at the close of books last year (June) which was 441. As of this writing we have 357 renewals or 81% leaving 84 members still pending. These names will be posted so anyone that knows one of these members can contact them to see what the problem is.

There has been some confusion about what the Legion year is. It is August 1 to July 31 of each year. If your card reads 2013 that is last year and your dues are not paid.


