Membership report

As of 3-28-14, against our last year's total of 441 members, we have 432 which is 97.96% Cut off for 100% is June 20th, and we have tried as reflected by our 23 new members and 16 transfers. We re in 6th place for the 8th District which has 24 Posts PLEASE help us make 100% by sending in your renewal.

Our dues cover and include four entities – National, Dept.(state), District and Post 615. During this last Jan. we were advised by the Dept. that they planned a 12.5% increase to their portion which would force Post 615 to increase its dues from \$30 to \$33 just to stay even. The Dept's increase was without justification or explanation and still needs to be approved at the State Convention therefore Post 615 filed a formal protest with the 8th District which was joined by 12 other Posts in the District requesting a "no" vote at the Convention until realistic justification is presented. Post 615's income has not risen by 12.5% and we doubt the same is true for our members personal income.

We still need everyone's DD 214 and e-mail address so if you have not submitted yours yet please do so.

If there are any WWII or Korean vets who have not been on the "Honor Flight" to DC please let us know so we can add your name to the list. Program is FREE.


